Court Sting

June 26, 2009

The Redding Police Department partnered with the Shasta County Marshall's Office and the Shasta County Probation Department to conduct a court sting at the Shasta County Court House this date. The premise of this operation was to confirm that individuals who reported to court on this day, and whose driver's licenses were suspended due to convictions for operating a vehicle while under the influence, were in fact complying with their suspension orders.

Individuals with a suspended driver's license were followed from the court house to a vehicle. If these people were observed driving away from the location, a traffic stop would subsequently be made on the vehicle.

Today's operation resulted in no one being cited for operating a vehicle on a suspended license, no arrests for (warrants etc.), and no vehicles towed or impounded.

This operation found that 100% of the suspended drivers that had court scheduled today, were found to be in compliance with their court issued orders. This is a significant turn around from what past operations have found, and the Redding Police Department is encouraged by these driver's cooperation in regards to their court issued orders and appreciate their assistance with safe driving practices.
